

School of Sport Education NT Interstate Swimming Team Nomination Process.

Sport Education NT competes in the annual School Sport Australia Swimming Championship. Students aged between 10 and 19 in the year of competition are eligible for selection. Multi-class students can be selected for this team.

In 2024 the School Sport Australia Championships will be held at the Gold Coast Swimming Complex, Southport, Queensland.

10-12 years 24-27 July. Born – 2012, 2013, 2014.

13-19 years 27-31 July. Born – 2011, 2010, 2009, 2008, 2007, 2006, 2005.

Benchmark times will be used to determine selection. These are reviewed annually by the interstate team officials and based on results from the previous year's School Sport Australia Championship. Achievement of a benchmark in one event will be sufficient for consideration for the team. Benchmark times for 2024 are provided in a separate document.

Team selection will be considered from times recorded at a qualifying event:

NT Open and Age Long Course Championships, 14-17 March 2024, at Parap Pool

Students who are unable to attend this event can still be considered for selection with officially recorded times.

If a student believes he or she is competitive at the relevant standard but is not a member of a swimming club, official timing can be done by a nominated person in each region. Please contact the Regional Sport Education Coordinator or the School of Sport Education NT office, (interstate.ssnt@education.nt.gov.au) for details.

Students wishing to nominate are strongly encouraged to participate in their regional inter-school carnival where possible.

Students will be required to nominate the events they wish to be considered for selection in on the nomination form.

Regional students or those who are not club members can nominate for selection. Times will be recorded under the supervision of an accredited coach. Times must be recorded in the year of competition, 2024.

All nominations must be received no later than Friday 22 March. Final selection will be confirmed on 4 April.
